

FARM TO TABLE CHAIR

AKA: Head honcho, Commander, Overlord, Czar, Superhero, Grand Poohbah, Captain, Title Role, Sheriff, Fearless Leader

After successfully hosting the first Downtown Hillsboro Farm to Table event in 2016, we thought 'We could really blow people's minds if we

weren't actually flying by the seat of our pants in 2017.' That's where you come into the picture, because you have enough event coordination experience to put an event together and are excited to take something great and make it even better. Your people and organization skills, in addition to your network of contacts and follow-through make you the perfect person to lead and motivate the committee of eager, skilled, and engaged volunteers that we have waiting for you.

Purpose of this role: The Executive Director and Board of Directors will have your back as you oversee this fundraising event from start to finish. We need someone to ensure everything comes together and that the second annual Farm to Table meets its objectives while embodying the values of the organization in all facets of implementation.

Results expected: Below are the results that this role needs to produce, but since there are many different paths to the same outcome, you will be responsible for choosing the paths that work best for you. And whether those paths are right-brained or left-brained, our Executive Director and key volunteers will be there to support your work along the way.

- The placement of ideal volunteers for the other lead coordination roles: farm, restaurant, beverage liaisons, sponsorship, logistics, and promotions. Then ensure that they have the resources and tools for success.
- Creation of realistic timelines and confirmation that deadlines are met. This may include scheduling and facilitating meetings, as well as developing agendas and checking in with individuals.
- Adherence to the approved budget.
- Feedback that demonstrates that event volunteers felt appreciated and will want to help again.
- A report that demonstrates quantitative outcomes and qualitative conclusions that recommended how the event can be improved in the future.
- Recommendation for an appropriate person to succeed you in this role next year (in the event you will not be returning, of course).

Qualifications: It's probably best if you bring these qualities with you, but if your goals include trying to develop these qualities, it may still be a good match.

• Ability to talk *and* listen. You will need to communicate regularly with passionate people from a variety of backgrounds.





- Ability to work in collaborative team setting and work independently: the yin and yang of event coordination.
- Ability to lead and ensure that scope doesn't creep and tangents don't dominate.
- Possession of good judgement and the discretion to follow the policies and best practices of the organization as they relate to the event coordination and implementation.
- Humbleness to ask for help when you need it and check in with the Executive Director about both the good things and the challenges.
- Willingness to professionally represent the Hillsboro Downtown Partnership's values of progress, cooperation, authenticity, resiliency, and attentiveness. This will mean spending a little time learning about what we do and why we do it before jumping into your role.
- Ability and willingness to commit to the time needed for success. Starting in February, this role will need to dedicate an average of 10 hours/week through the end of July. You will have your own Number Two to help cover conflicts and lessen the load when deadlines are looming.
- And, most importantly, you must be available the entire day/night of the event: Friday, July 14, 2017. (This one is the real deal-breaker.)
